SWOOP!

Beware swooping birds in the area

Birds swoop to protect their eggs or young in the nest during breeding season. Swooping can cause serious injury and be a frightening experience. All our native birds are protected and there are serious penalties for taking eggs, harassing or causing injury to native wildlife.



Protecting yourself

DO

- Avoid the area if possible
- If you must pass – move quickly – do not run
- Wear a hat or carry a stick or umbrella above your head
- Cyclists should wear a helmet, dismount and walk when in the area
- Try to travel in a group
- Draw a pair of 'eyes' and attach to the back of hats and helmets. A printable set of 'eyes' is available at www.depi.vic.gov.au/swoop

DO NOT

- Harass or interfere with the birds. This gives them added reason to see humans as a threat
- Destroy nests as the birds may re-nest, prolonging the swooping behaviour
- Feed swooping birds

Introduction of school bus special service – Wollert to Edgars Creek Secondary College

From Monday 19 August 2019, a special school bus will start from Wollert to Edgars Creek Secondary College.

What this means to students at Edgars Creek Secondary College:

- The service will operate on school days Monday to Friday during the school term
- There will be one morning trip and one afternoon trip per day to align with school bell times
- The morning bus will depart at 7.55am from Pine Park Drive and Saltlake Boulevard in Wollert and arrive at the college at 8.25am
- The afternoon bus will depart the college at 3.20pm and finish at Pine Park Drive and Saltlake Boulevard at 3.50pm
- The bus will pick up/set down at existing bus stops on Route 356, north of Flindon Road, and existing bus stops on Route 358, north of Dherns Road (except the terminus). Refer to the map on the back.
- The route names displayed for this service will be: School Bus – Edgars Creek Secondary
- The bus will be myki fare enabled
- The bus will be low floor to allow for students with accessibility needs to use the service.

Please note:

As standard with new bus services, the timetable for the school bus special service will be reviewed later in the year and minor adjustments may be made. Any changes will be communicated to the college.
