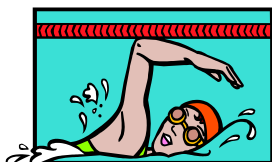
## 5/6 SPORT PROGRAM 2019

### Rugby Tournament (Date changed)



Squads for the boys and girls (year 5 and 6) have been selected for rugby. Due to our gala day being cancelled EVPS have been given an opportunity to proceed through to the State Finals. Boys are playing on Monday November 18th and the girls on Wednesday 20th November. Games will be held at Jacana Reserve, Broadmeadows. A permission note for after school training is on Compass if your child has not already completed it.

### Swimming Program-Year Prep, 1 and 2 in term 4



In **term 4**, we are offering an **intensive five day** swimming program at the **Epping Leisure City (YMCA)** with each session running for 45 minutes. The levels are in accordance with the YMCA Swim Program which is a balance of basic swimming skills-**stroke development**, **simulated open water activities** and **water safety** - learning about different water environments that exist, the dangers that may be present and how to deal with them. Our school has been booked in for 6 lessons, with **classes** attending **each lesson**.

**Year Prep– December 13th, 14th, 17th, 18th, 19th and 20th**

**Year 1 and 2 will either go in group 1 or group 2. Grades will be notified which group closer to the event.**

**Group 1: 3rd, 4th, 5th, 6th, 7th and 10th**

**Group 2: 13th, 14th, 17th, 18th, 19th and 20th**

Swimming is a life skill and is part of the Victorian curriculum where students practise a range of movement patterns in aquatic environments. A permission form will be available first day of term 4.

## GAMES IN THE PARK

*The weather is getting warmer and it's a great time to be outside! Put on some comfortable walking shoes and go for a stroll, or head down to the local park with the family and get active - take a ball, skipping rope or other fun game to play, such as this one:*

### **Meet a Tree Game**

The Meet a Tree Game tests how well kids know the trees in their favourite park -- and how well they remember details. Kids use every sense but sight to explore a tree, and then see if they can find that tree again once their sight is restored. Play this easy outdoor game for kids in a wooded area or a park with lots of trees.

### **What You'll Need:**

Area with a lot of trees

Partner

Blindfold



**Step 1:** Pair up, or work together as a family. One person in each team puts on a blindfold.

**Step 2:** The partner turns the blindfolded person around two or three times, and then leads the person in a zig-zag path to a tree. The partner must be very careful to lead the blindfolded person around dangers.

**Step 3:** The blindfolded person explores the tree, taking as much time as he or she needs to feel the texture of the bark, find bumps or hollows, and find patches of moss or other features.

**Step 4:** When the blindfolded person is done, the partner leads him or her in a zig-zag path away from the tree, turning the blindfolded person around two or three times in the middle.

**Step 5:** The blindfolded person takes the blindfold off and tries to find the same tree.

**Step 6:** The partners switch places and explore another tree.
